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Guidelines for Completing an Application for an Area Variance

Overview

The Zoning Ordinance defines an Area Variance as the authorization by the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) for the use of land in a manner which is not allowed by the dimensional or physical requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.

<u>Application</u>

An applicant seeking an Area Variance must show that the benefit the applicant stands to receive from the variance will outweigh the burden to health, safety and welfare of the community.

The applicant must complete an Application for an Area Variance in its entirety. Attach additional pages and drawings (building requesting variance on, sign, etc.), such as a site plan (placement of the structures on the property with the measurements from property lines, etc.), as necessary to explain your reasoning. Please consider the five factors the ZBA must evaluate when presenting your explanation. (See below)

Fees

There are two fees that are due for an area variance application:

Application Fee of \$100 is due upon submission. (Please make check payable to 'Town of Greenwich')

Certified mailing fees are due at the time the public hearing is set. The amount due is based on the number of property owners that need to be notified. All property owners adjoining and within 500 ft of the applicant's property will need to be notified. The ZBA Clerk will inform the applicant what their fees will be. (Please make check payable to 'Post Master')

Process

Once the application has been submitted it will be placed on the agenda for the next available meeting date. The ZBA meets the first Thursday of each month, pending business. Once the ZBA has reviewed the completed application it will set a public hearing, at which time certified mailing fees are due (ZBA Clerk will tell the amount due at this time). If the property is located within 500 feet of a municipal boundary, right-of-way of County/State Expressway, Highway or Road, and/or the boundary of County/State owned land then a referral must be sent to the Washington County Planning Board. This referral process may delay the application for one month depending on the submission date of the area variance application. After the public hearing has been closed the ZBA will make it's decision. The applicant or his/her designated person(s) must be present at the time the public hearing is held and also at the time of the ZBA's decision. A Decision and Findings form will be mailed 5-10 business days after the decision of the ZBA.

Decision and Findings

The ZBA by law considers the following five factors when making a decision:

- 1. Whether an undesirable change would be produced in the character of the neighborhood or a detriment to nearby properties.
- 2. Whether the benefit sought by the applicant can be achieved by a feasible alternative to the variance.
- 3. Whether the requested variance is substantial.
- 4. Whether the variance will have an adverse impact on the physical or environmental conditions in the neighborhood.
- 5. Whether the alleged difficulty was self-created.
